Frustrated with refusal to come to the table

Over 1000 Yale Workers Bring the Bargaining Table to Yale Pres. Levin

Frustrated with Yale president Richard Levin's refusal to negotiate with them and the absence of administration decision makers at the bargaining table, over 1000 Yale workers will bring the bargaining table to offices of President Levin on <u>Friday, March 14</u>, at 12:10 p.m. at Woodbridge Hall, on Wall at College St., New Haven.

Contract negotiations resumed this past Tuesday, after a weeklong strike that saw 4000 Yale workers walk off the job and mounting pressure on the Yale administration to fix their notorious anti-union tradition. After three days of bargaining, Yale negotiators continue to refuse to address key issues of wages, pensions, job training and advancement, and job security. Yale also continues to refuse to talk to graduate student employees and hospital workers about a fair process for them to choose to unionize, without management intimidation or delays.

Workers have repeatedly asked President Levin and other decision makers in the Yale administration to meet with them in hopes reaching an agreement without further disruption.
