Barbara Ehrenreich joins Yale women workers' fight Candlelight vigil: "A Woman's Place is in Her Union"


New Haven, CT—Barbara Ehrenreich, author of bestseller *Nickel & Dimed: On (Not) Getting By in America,* will join hundreds of Yale workers when they take to the streets again, in a march/rally planned for 6:30pm on Wednesday, Dec. 10.

The action will coincide with hundreds of simultaneous actions for the right to organize, coordinated nationwide by the AFL-CIO. About 2000 Yale hospital workers and 2000 Yale graduate teachers have been trying for years to organize a union. Yale won't agree to a fair process to unionize. For both graduate teachers and hospital workers, the family health insurance provided by Yale is so expensive, and their wages so low, that they have had to go on welfare to insure their children through the state's HUSKY program. Wednesday's action will spotlight this and other women's issues.
